




ROBERT FROST TRAIL: BULL HILL

ROBERT FROST TRAIL: BULL HILL

SUNDERLAND, MASS



This hilly out-and-back is perfect for hikers, snowshoers, and trail runners looking for a moderate challenge. You can summit two prominent hills on the south end of the Mount Toby Range through beautiful, diverse forest while admiring the area's unique geological formations.

SUGGESTED ROUTE

From Bull Hill Road, follow the orange blazes of the Robert Frost trail up a short but steep incline into the woods. Be sure to watch for blazes in the early section as there are a number of unmarked intersecting trails. Look for two small **glacial erratics** (rocks from other places left behind by the glacier), the first on your right and the second on your left, before heading up **steep terrain**. At the top of the **summit** of the hill, look for **cliffs** to your right and a very impressive **glacial erratic** to your left.

Descend three steep switchbacks, continue down a gentle downhill and **admire the cliffs** to your right. Turn right at the intersection (continue to follow the orange blazes), and follow more **steep terrain** to the summit of Bull Hill. Turn around, and look for a **southerly view** if you are hiking when the leaves are down, and head back to the parking area. If you are feeling ambitious, you can take a challenging hike all the way to Mount Toby (3 mile round trip from Bull Hill summit).

DIRECTIONS

- **GPS address: 2 Bull Hill Rd, Sunderland, MA**
- Small gravel parking area with room for two cars perpendicular to the road

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Glacial erratic rock formations
- Ledges and cliffs
- Rugged terrain

YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Open dawn to dusk, year round
- Bull Hill summit offers views only in fall and winter when leaves are down
- Trail passes through private lands. Please respect private property by staying on the trail.*
